#### The CH Cicero Gus UDT Cup

The Ch Cicero Gus UDT Cup was presented by William & Jane Pferd in honor of the breed's first Utility obedience dog. The <u>story of Gus and his owners Chuck and Lori Hatz</u> immediately follows the award description.





The award is presented to recognize the Welsh Springer Spaniel which has performed with consistency and quality in advanced levels of obedience. The award is open to all Welsh Springers competing in Open A or B and Utility A or B classes at AKC recognized Obedience Trials. In the event that there are no Welsh in the advanced classes, the award will be opened to all Welsh competing in Novice A or B classes at AKC recognized Obedience Trials.

In order to become eligible for the annual award, the owner of the Welsh Springer Spaniel must be a member in good standing with the Welsh Springer Spaniel Club of America, Inc. for the full award year. The award will go to the Welsh Springer Spaniel which has earned the five (5) highest scores in Open A or B or Utility A or B classes at AKC Obedience Trials. If there is a tie with five scores, the next (6<sup>th</sup>) highest score is added to the tally and so forth until the tie is broken.

The award year is from January 1 thru December 31 of a given year. All scores are tabulated from official results published in the AKC Gazette Awards; the award is presented at the WSSCA Annual Meeting held in conjunction with the WSSCA National Specialty.

#### **Chuck Hatz on the Training of CH Cicero Gus UDT**

When Lori and I first started going to AKC dog shows, she gravitated to the conformation ring, and I enjoyed obedience work more, so, our roles were set pretty early.

I had never worked a dog in obedience before, and many of Gus's early problems stemmed from the opposite end of the leash. He tended to work too quickly, and I didn't slow him down as I should have. He did not score well in novice, probably



averaging in the low 180's; looking back, I showed him well before he was ready. I believe it took six shows for him to get his CD.



When we started working, I was committed to seeing this process through, so we worked every day for two years. Living in suburban Chicago for most of that time, included working him in the apartment we had, or the basement, when weather forced us inside.

Gus took to Open work like he was born to it, and by this time we were enrolled in obedience classes at the Chicago Park District under the supervision of Mr. Harry Taft. We met once a week and Harry was usually available for extra sessions on the weekend. I had made my own jumps, so working at home was not an issue. I believe Gus earned his CDX in four shows, working steadily in the low 190s.

Utility was a challenge, since there were no other dogs at CPD working utility, and again, the trainer's deficiencies were magnified. Despite that, Gus finished his UD in six shows in the 190s, with articles causing the most problems.

Tracking was a whole "new ballgame". Again, we started from scratch. Gus was a very willing pupil, but working fast in tracking is a definite handicap. He failed two attempts at his TD. About that time I was transferred by my company from Chicago to Minnesota. Things looked bleak till Lori stepped in and said she would take over the training to try to get his degree. She knew quite a bit about tracking, since she was the one who "laid" most of his training tracks. Lori got a lot of help from Herb Semple and Dick Christ, two trainers with the German Shepherd Dog Training Club. She also worked at a much slower pace which was to Gus's benefit. He got his TD at his first tracking trial with her on the tracking lead!

Training him was an absolute delight. And he is still missed these many years later.
